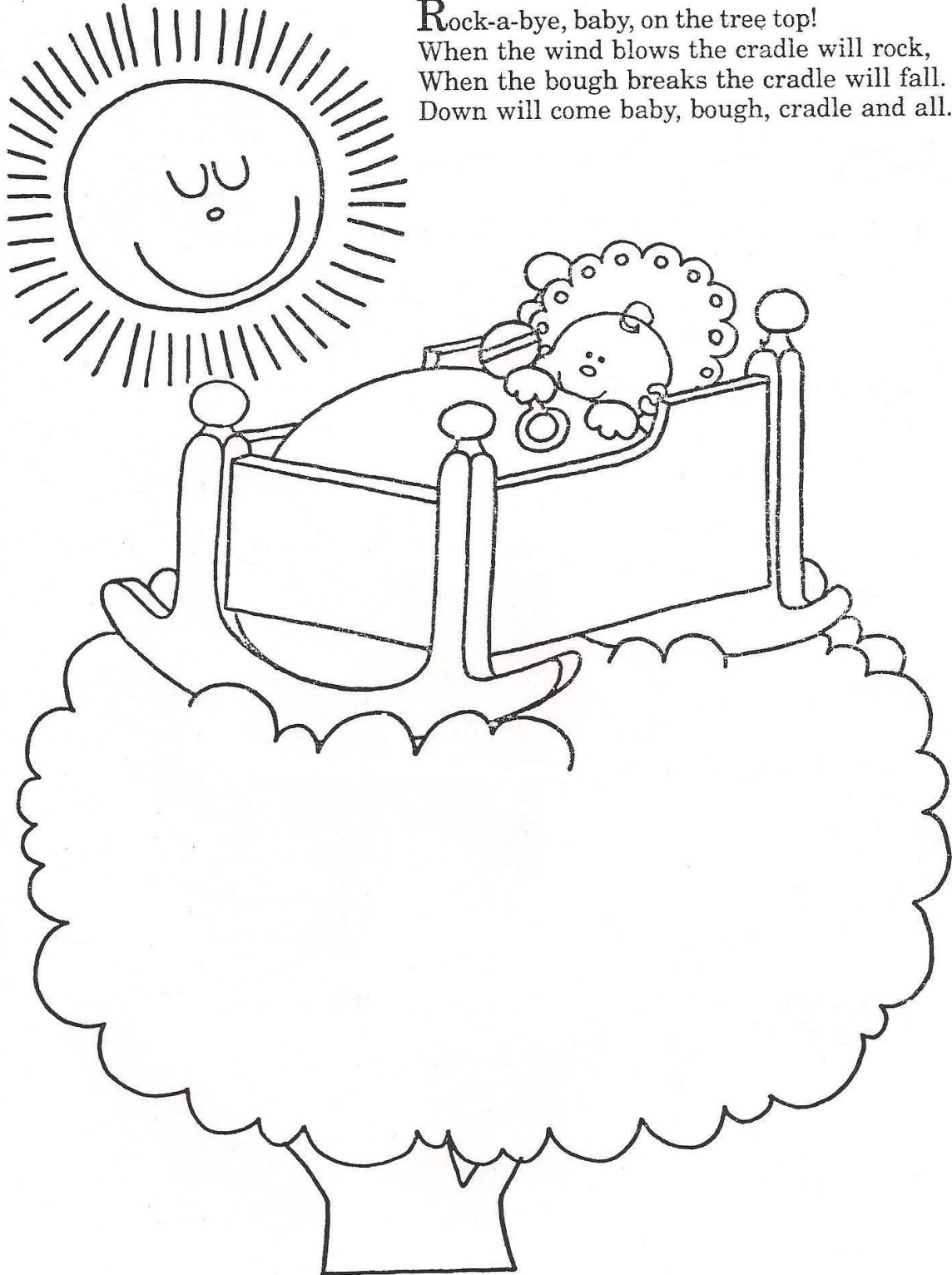


Are you left or right handed? Tell the student next to you. Now, color the picture using your opposite hand. Then answer the questions on the next page.

Down will come baby, bough, cradle and all.

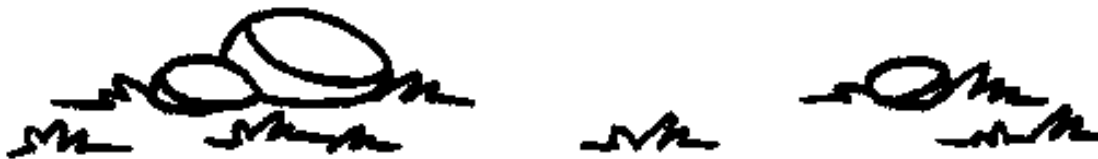
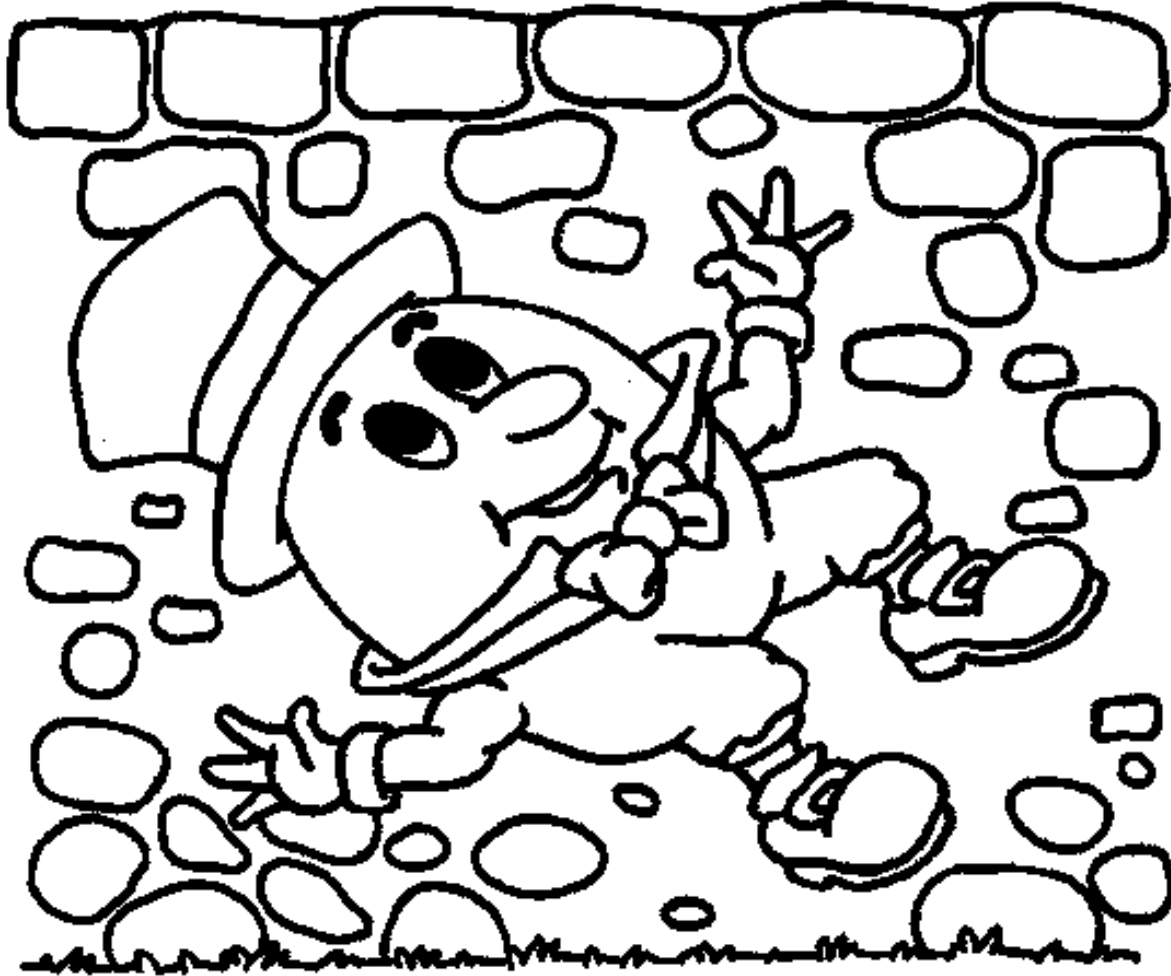
